1-Berneray explorer circular walk take in the island's beautiful beaches and highest point 2. Dun an Sticer investigate the remains of an impressive Iron Age broch 3. Udal Peninsula walk enjoy the machair, monuments and beaches from every angle 4·Vallay Island walk explore the ruins on this uninhabited island and race the tide home! 5. Scolpaig Crater walk check out the dramatic crater (careful not to slip!) and watch for whales 6·Hosta Beach relax on this white sandy beach, with a good chance of waves - beware of riptides! 7.RSPB Balranald a great spot for wildlife watching, for birds, otters and cetaceans 8. Trinity Temple a short walk from the road to the remains of Scotland's oldest University 9-Baleshare Beach a beautiful long beach on a tidal island with good parking

10-Eaval walk to North Uist's highest point on a clear day for stunning views
